

college Seccarecci attended the Arizona State University from 1983 to 1987, where he played on the men's soccer team in the Pac 10
Conference. He graduated from ASU in 1987 with a bachelor's degree in Sociology. Professional In 1989, Seccarecci turned
professional with the Arizona Cardinals of the Major Indoor Soccer League. In 1991, he moved to the Philadelphia Fury of MISL for
the 1991–1992 season. In March 1992, he was selected in the sixth round (60th overall) of the National Soccer League draft by the
Pittsburgh Riverhounds. In July 1992, the Riverhounds traded Seccarecci's rights to the Buffalo Blizzard for the rights to Gary Shaw.
In the fall of 1993, the Blizzard sold Seccarecci's contract to the Columbus Eagles for what was to have been \$10,000. In 1994,
Seccarecci finished his playing career.
